Wouldn't it be great if we were perfect people! We would never judge anyone who is different than ourselves or on standards we ourselves could not maintain. We would never hurt another person, by intention or inadvertently. We would never act rashly but make appropriate decisions at the appropriate time. There would be no neighborhood disputes, no family arguments, no church conflict.

Alas, that is not the world we live in and that is not who we are as humans. Everyone of us, from the CEO to the mail clerk, from the President to the beggar on the street, from the clergy to the laity, we all fail to live as God had imagined for us. As Romans 3 states: "...all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

One of the things that is a gift from God to our faith is the weekly practice of confession and absolution. I have said before that when I turn toward the altar for confession, I am praying for all the ways that I have failed as a child of God. I think about the times I have not been understanding, not shown compassion, been resentful or stubborn. I trust that God will be forgiving of those failures even if they are the same failures I listed the last ten times I prayed for forgiveness.

Then we encounter that phrase from the Lord's Prayer: "Forgive us our sins **as we forgive** those who sin against us." [emphasis mine] Where am I blocking my own forgiveness because I must continue to hold on to unforgiving feelings towards others? OUCH! But we have the assurance which is expressed in Peters sermon in Acts 10. The whole of scriptures point us to the one who brings forgiveness of sins—Jesus Christ. That is why we gather weekly, confess our sins and participate in the Eucharist, knowing that our faith in Christ has sent us free from the bondage of our imperfections. Blessed are all of you who do a better job of forgiving others than I ever will.

We build therapeutic communities by creating a village of refuge for children and youth traumatized by conflict – war orphans, former child soldiers, and members of displaced families.

A note to Dorothy from her son on May 25... We were invited to meet with Queen Aisha this morning at the Adamawa Emirate palace. This kingdom has a fascinating history which goes back into the 1700s. Before the colonialization of West Africa, this kingdom stretched across this part of northern Nigeria, northern Cameroon, and into Chad. A very gracious woman, the queen is a strong champion of women and children's rights and is anxious to see ChildVoice established here. She apologized for not meeting us inside the palace, but it seems that apart from the Lamido (king), only women are allowed inside. So she met us in a receiving room just inside the palace gates.



Luckily the child sat and waited and all was ok. If there is no staff in the room, please take them to another room for drop off!

Breaking Barriers

After years of living in fear, surrounded by violence in his home country of Burundi, Firmin wanted to create a better life for the family he and his wife, Emma, dreamed of.

They fled to Tanzania, where they lived in a refugee camp for 13 years. While there, Firmin worked as a principal in the camp's school and he and Emma welcomed two baby boys, Dan and Joshua. But when the Tanzanian government closed the camp, he and his family were sent to live in the U.S. as refugees. When he arrived in the U.S., Firmin came to LSI's Refugee Community Services to attend English classes and become familiar with his new home.

Firmin and Emma have spent the last 10 years raising their family in Des Moines, and Firmin is finding ways to give back and support more lowa kids and families. During the school year, Firmin can be found in the halls and classrooms of public schools across the Des Moines district. He is one of several bilingual outreach community workers in the schools, translating for families who speak Swahili, Kirundi, Kinyarwanda, Kinyamulenge, and French.

In his free time, Firmin works as a direct support caregiver in the Des Moines area, and he spends his weekends as a pastor at a local church. He loves that he can help ease the congregation's daily stresses and lingering trauma through prayer and worship.

Dan and Joshua are now in high school and Firmin and Emma have welcomed two daughters, Grace and Selah, in Iowa.

29 *Peter and Paul, apostles* We thank God for servants like Peter and Paul who confessed their faith in Jesus Christ, used their unique gifts to spread the good news and helped grow the early Christian church. We pray the Spirit will guide and stir us to continue the work of growing the church even today—especially today.

30 As many teachers, educators and school staffs begin summer breaks, we ask God to grant them rest and renewal and to stir their enthusiasm and creativity for serving young people and communities.
